The IBMA Songwriter Mentor Program by Jessie Lang August 22, 2019

The songwriter mentor program is a wonderful way to dive deep into the world of songwriting, with a professional who can help you achieve your composition goals in a one-on-one setting. I highly recommend this innovative program, as co-writing is such a great way to bring out the best work of two artists.

I discovered the IBMA Songwriter Mentor Program when I attended the business conference for the first time in 2016. I enjoyed several seminars that year and learned a great deal about the music industry from a wide range of musicians and guest speakers. At the end of one of these sessions, I introduced myself to Rick Lang and told him of my interest in growing as a songwriter. He graciously listened to my background and accepted a copy of my first CD (Coming Home by The Lang Sisters). The CD had a few original songs on it and several folk and bluegrass standards.

In the following months, Rick and I connected primarily through email and Skype. I was fairly new to songwriting but had a lot of passion for music and an appreciation for meaningful lyrics. Rick is a very positive person, and his love of songwriting and music is contagious. Despite his busy schedule, we stayed in touch and worked on materials together for the next couple of years. Rick helped me develop and refine lyrics, always being open in the process while encouraging first rate work. As a songwriter, getting feedback on your work during the writing process is so important in developing your craft! The first full length song we completed together was "Tell Me a Story" which I recorded with The Carolina PineCones band. This song has touched many audience members who have shared their appreciation for it; and there is really no better feeling than knowing your song has connected with someone.

A year later, Rick and I finished another very special song called "Broken", which we will have the honor of performing at the IBMA songwriter showcase event this year. We've never performed together so this is really exciting! I never would have dreamed three years ago that I would have the honor and privilege of performing an original song in such a prestigious showcase, but thanks to the support and encouragement of Rick Lang and this innovative IBMA Songwriter Mentor Program directed by Tony Rackley, we were able to write a very special song that I look forward to sharing. In 2020, I hope to move to Nashville to attend college and continue studying music and songwriting, and I am incredibly grateful to IBMA for this program
